

**AWS VPC:  
Virtual Private Confusion?**

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It used to be simple

You went to AWS.

Created a new node.

Maybe added some disk to it.

And off you went, computing happily ever after.

## Too simple

Catch: Everyone's nodes were in one subnet.

We could all see one another.

Maybe your neighbor wasn't pretty.

Maybe they'd been cracked.

Whatever reason, you want *privacy*.

Private, no longer simple

OK, but no more ‘just create a node’.

Creation starts with a “Virtual Private Cloud”.

Then you get to create subnets, security rules, IP gateways, NAT Gateways in multiple availability zones in multiple regions... Got that?

# AWS Nomenclature

AWS services are provided in “Regions”.

“us-east”, “us-west”, “canada”.

Regions have “Availability Zones”.

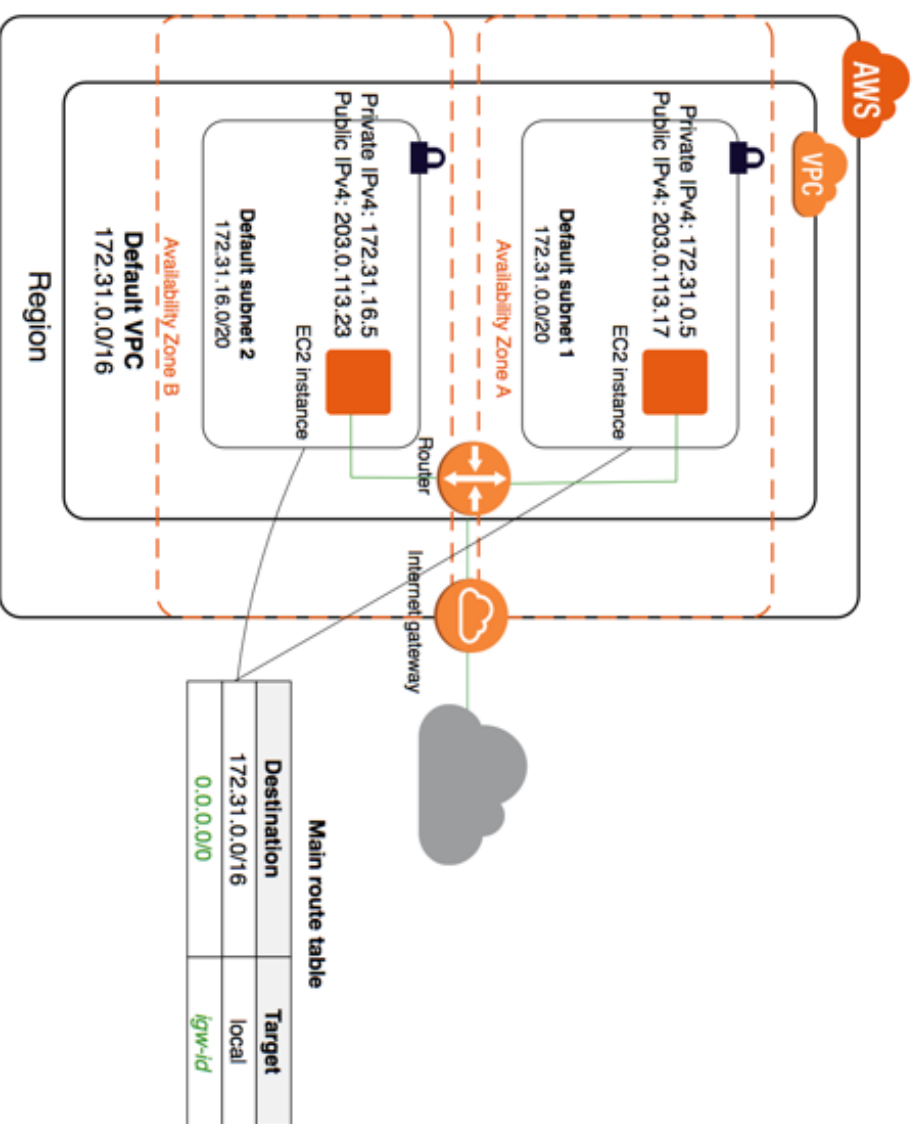
Designed to fail separately.

Redundancy uses multiple zones within a region.

EC2 & subnets make heavy use of zones.
